On December 7, 1955, Dr. George Simkins along with five friends would defy rules of segregation at the Gillespie Park Golf Course by placing their greens fees on the counter – 75 cents each – and proceeding to play a round. With the police and course staff following them, the group played through the ninth hole and left. Later the same day, each of them would be arrested for trespassing. Instead of entering guilty pleas, Dr. Simkins would lead the group in launching a case wherein the US District Court would side with them ordering the course to be desegregated.

*“Citizenship in the United States imposes uniform burdens, such as paying taxes and bearing arms for the preservation and operation of our government. In like manner whatever advantages or privileges one citizen in the United States may enjoy through his liberty becomes the constitutional right of each citizen and without regard to race, color or creed. These principles of law have been fully and elaborately established in the Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals *566 and by the Supreme Court of the United States and must be adhered to in this case.”*

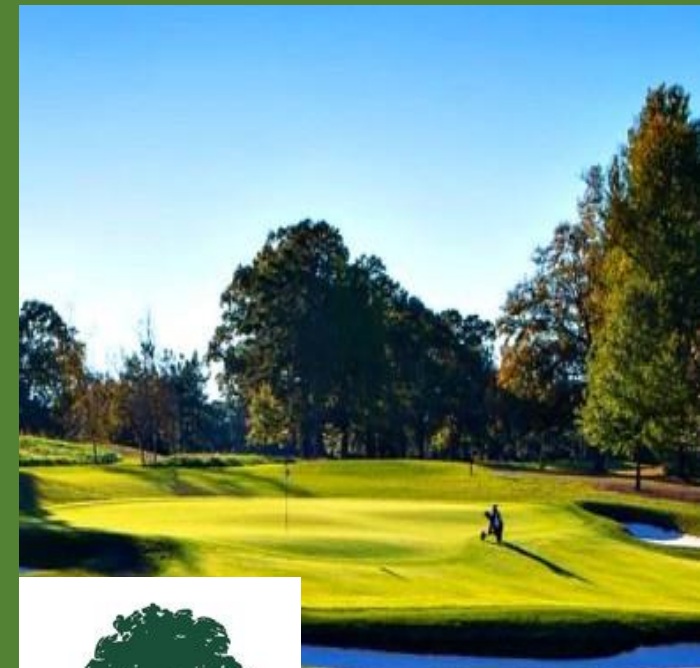
